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There is no way around it: the Greek word ekklesia means something more and different than the English word church. The gap is meaningful and real

Ekklesia Rising Words create culture. By adopting the word church with its totally different etymology, instead of the more contextually accurate word of Christ, exklesia, the movement of God has been in a rut for 2,000 years

Why Ekklesia?

- ▶ Ekklesia is what Jesus Christ said He would build
- The word church is both a mistranslation and a misrepresentation of what He said
- Access into the Ekklesia is by revelation of Jesus Christ – not joining a system or movement
- Revelation creates the possibility for divine reality to find a place of manifestation in the earth
- In transition, your actions will reflect the power of your revelation

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Biblical View of the Ekklesia

- Ekklesia is governmental and the sole representative of the Kingdom of Heaven in the earth
- The concern of the King is His citizenry, His Kingdom, and its expansion in the earth
- Ekklesia is a body of called out kingdom citizens who are actively
 engaged in the kosmos (world) in order to influence nations with the
 values of the Kingdom of Heaven
- ..to the intent that now the manifold wisdom of God might be made known by the [ekklesia] to the principalities and powers in the heavenly places, according to the eternal purpose which He accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord, (Ephesians 3:10-11)

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- Who gather one or more times each week (for a definable purpose) under the Headship of Jesus Christ
- **Definition of** Who support each other's on-going work of being and making disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ
 - Who submit and relate to elders, ministry gifts, and apostolic leaders
 - Who participate in planting and supporting new assemblies of believers to do the same with their prayers, time, finances, and material resources


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
The Language of Transition


A Working
